The Environmental Foundation of Jamaica (EFJ) in collaboration with the Ministry of Economic Growth and Job Creation (MEGJC), through funding of One Million Two Hundred Thousand United States Dollars (USD 1.2M) provided by the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), presents this call for proposals under the project “Adaptation Programme and Financing Mechanisms for PPCR Jamaica” for the following Climate Smart Initiatives:

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ACCESSING GRANTS FROM THE SCCAF

Grants from the SCCAF may be accessed by community based organizations (CBOs), non-governmental organizations (NGOs), other civil society groups (CSGs) and selected public sector agencies, for clearly defined high priority activities, particularly related to building resilience to climate change and particularly to develop, test and demonstrate approaches, best practices and solutions, contributing to livelihoods protection and poverty reduction.

1. Each CBO/NGO/CSG must be legally registered in Jamaica as a non-profit entity, a cooperative or a society. Each organization must display evidence of the existence of:
 - a. An executive body,
 - b. Annual financial statements,
 - c. Minutes of their meetings and
 - d. Evidence that the community or stakeholders are aware of the project and its likely impact.
2. Public sector entities must be working at the community level implementing projects that seek to enhance their own capacities and/or the capacities of related communities to cope better with the increased changes to frequency, intensity, duration, and distribution of climate-induced hazards and vulnerability.
3. Special consideration will be given to women's groups and vulnerable groups

APPLICATION PERIOD

Proposals for the call will only be accepted during the period October 3, 2016 - November 11, 2016. Proposals received outside of this designated Call Period or outside of the criteria above **will not** be considered.

Forms must be submitted to the EFJ's offices, 1b Norwood Avenue, Kingston 5, no later than **3:30 p.m.** (local time) on Friday November 11, 2016 and may be submitted by mail, hand delivered or e-mailed to grants@efj.org.jm. Forms **will not** be accepted by FAX. **Incomplete proposals will not be considered.**

Potential grantees/applicants intending to submit proposals for the 2016 Call and who wish to develop their proposal-writing skills are invited to attend one of the three (3) Proposal Writing Workshops being planned by the EFJ.

In order to participate in any of these one-day workshops, all interested persons **MUST** pre-register no later than **October 14, 2016**, by contacting the EFJ offices.
